Applications due	January I 0, 2025 before 5 p.m.
Deadline for questions	November 20, 2024, by 12 p.m.
Publication of responses to Q&A	December 6, 2024, 5:00pm
Anticipated notification of funding decisions	May 14, 2025
Funding period (two-year term)	July 1, 2025 — June 30, 2026 July 1, 2026 — June 30, 2027



RFP FUNDING

- An average of \$100,000 per year/per project
- Contracts will be funded for up to two years
- Total available is \$200,00 for twoyear period

FUNDING EXAMPLES

- Project example A: San Mateo Prevention Strategies submits a proposal for \$75k per year for a total of \$150K. The full proposal could be funded leaving \$25K per year available for another proposal.
- Project example B: San Mateo Prevention Strategies submits a proposal for \$125k per year for a total of \$250K. The full proposal would NOT be funded. The total amount available is an average of \$100K per year per proposal.
- Project example C: San Mateo Prevention Strategies submits a proposal for \$50K year one and \$150K year two. The proposal would be evaluated for possible funding.

PURPOSE

CHIP OVERVIEW

Improvement Plan (CHIP): The CHIP outlines key objectives and strategies to address determinants of health that will lead to improvements in health outcomes. It lays out the strategic effort to address health issues based on results of the Community Health Assessment (CHA).



Priority Area 1: Access to Health Care Services

Overarching Goal: Increase the proportion of San Mateo community members who can easily access quality health care services that meet their holistic needs, especially individuals and communities who are experiencing barriers caused by structural inequities including, but not limited to, racism, sexism, classicism, ageism, and homophobia.



Strategy 1:

Expand access to successful community-focused programs that improve access to health care services

Objective 1.1: By December 2026, increase knowledge about successful community-focused programs that improve access to health care services, especially for populations impacted by structural inequities, among community providers.

Strategy 2:

Enhance coordination of delivery of health care services across County and community programs **Objective 2.1:** By December 2026, increase utilization of community navigators (e.g., community health worker, promotoras, family and community engagement coordinator) among medical providers.

Objective 2.2: By December 2026, increase completed referrals by successful programs that improve access to health care services, especially for populations impacted by structural inequities, among community providers.

Priority Area 2: Social Determinants of Health

Overarching Goal: Improve coordination among organizations providing essential services across sectors to all individuals and communities in San Mateo County, especially those currently experiencing disparities.



Strategy 1:

Advocate for policies across sectors that improve the social determinants of health **Objective 1.1:** By December 2026, increase knowledge about the policy ecosystem among the Community Health Improvement Collaborative.

Objective 1.2: By December 2026, increase knowledge about the impact of social determinants of health policies among major public and private entities/organizations/networks.


Strategy 2:

Enhance coordination of delivery of essential services across County and community programs

Objective 2.1: By December 2026, increase social determinants of health screening by 50% at all client visits among all provider types (medical and social services).


Objective 2.2: By December 2026, increase completed referrals addressing social determinants of health.

PROPOSER ELIGIBILITY

- Any non-profit, faith-based organization, city, school, program of groups of individuals is eligible.
- A group of individuals or a program that is not a part of an organization, must indicate a fiscal sponsor that will sign the contract, receive, and manage funds on your group's behalf.

PROPOSER ELIGIBILITY

This funding is **NOT** intended for the following:

- Support for a program or a staff position that already exists without demonstration of significant expansion of their responsibilities.
- Projects that have San Mateo County Department(s) as primary/lead applicants or include funding request for San Mateo County staff person's salary.
- Projects for which the majority of beneficiaries are outside of San Mateo County.
- Lobbying or direct policy advocacy efforts of community organizing.



APPLICATION FAQS ANSWERED

- Proposers must use the application provided
- Proposers must submit the application via OpenGov
- Proposers must register on SAM.gov and include ID on application
- Proposers DO NOT have to have a DUNS number
- Proposers can submit more than one Project application BUT each application must be submitted separately
- A cover letter and letters of support are not required
- Resource documents: <u>Funding Application Resources Get Healthy San</u> <u>Mateo County (gethealthysmc.org)</u>

SUBMITTING MULTIPLE APPLICATIONS

- Proposer may submit one application per CHIP Priority Area, i.e., Access to Health Care Services, Social Determinants of Health, and Mental Health (total of three separate applications)
- Proposers cannot combine priority areas into one proposal
- OpenGov will allow for three applications to be uploaded

EVALUATION CRITERIA

40% - Project Impact

20% - Project Success

15% - Experience

25% - Budget

ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE SERVICES

Goal: Projects that expand access to quality, holistic health care for San Mateo community members, especially those facing barriers.

Strategy I:

Expand access to successful community-focused programs that improve access to health care services.



Strategy 2:

Enhance coordination of access to health care services across County and community programs.



ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE SERVICES

Project Examples Include:

- Act as a lead community-based organization, community clinic, or Federally Qualified Health
 Center to hire community members interested in serving as Community Health Workers
 (CHWs) to address any emerging needs identified by the CHIP and/or the organization
- Support pathways for CHW workforce preparedness to build core skills and competencies
 needed to work in the fields of public health, health care, and social services by supporting
 CHW training, field experience, and other requirements for certification
- Create or expand linkages with educational institutions/organizations that provide CHW training to build core skills and competencies needed to work in the fields of public health, health care, and social services
- Build the organization's capacity to develop or expand the system for Medi-Cal reimbursement of CHW services through training or partnership

SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Goal: Improve coordination among organizations providing essential services across sectors to all individuals and communities in San Mateo County, especially those currently experiencing disparities.

SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Project Examples Include:

- Provide responsive and evidence-based training and ongoing technical assistance for youth- and family-serving providers (which could include school staff, childcare and afterschool care providers, law enforcement, case managers, etc.) to support youth wellness
- Expand or sustain programs that give community members knowledge, skills, and opportunities to advocate for changes that impact community health.
- Strengthen the capacity of neighborhood coalitions working to address <u>social determinants of</u>
 <u>health</u>
- Support the development of school, district, or city level plans for Restorative Justice model implementation in responding to youth needs and behaviors
- Develop best practices and policies to expand Food as Medicine Model including recommendations to support public and private health insurance reimbursement for medically tailored food and nutrition interventions.

MENTAL HEALTH

Goal: Develop a county-wide and cohesive approach to improve mental well-being with a focus on decreasing disparities, especially among individuals and communities who are experiencing barriers. caused by structural inequities including, but not limited to, racism, sexism, classism, ageism, and homophobia.



Strategies for the mental health work group of the CHIP have yet to be finalized.

MENTAL HEALTH

Project Examples Include:


- Create youth-led mentoring and leadership program to support mental wellbeing and connectedness
- Create or expand youth and family driven programs to address mental wellbeing, stigma reduction, or linkage to mental health/substance use services
- Develop or expand evidence-based interventions designed to address community violence
- Strengthen connections between youth, parents, school staff, mental health providers, and other stakeholders to improve school climate and increase supportive relationships for youth






