
D. Cross-Cutting Strategies that Address Multiple Types of Issues/Need







CCCS FRAMEWORK TIERS RELATIVE COST



\$ = lowest cost
(use one \$100 dollar bill)



\$\$ = moderate cost

(use two \$100 dollar bills)



\$\$\$ = highest cost

(use three \$100 dollar bills)
