Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Released

The Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) for San Mateo County has been created and the report is now available. The 2024-2026 CHIP outlines how San Mateo County Health and its partners plan to collaborate on enhancing health and promoting health equity. This plan is the result of a seven-month assessment and planning process involving over 90 partners, including representatives from divisions throughout San Mateo County Health, community-based organizations, behavioral health organizations, hospitals, health plans, and community advocates and leaders. The plan emphasizes joint efforts in three key priority areas:

- Access to Health Care Services
- Social Determinants of Health
- Mental Health (Please note that strategies and objectives for this area are under development; an updated report will be issued once finalized)



This significant achievement represents San Mateo County's inaugural CHIP, although partners have previously worked together on various assessments and plans that have guided our collaborative initiatives. Our goals for this process included:

- To develop and improve engagement with community members to identify and guide health priorities
- To establish a meaningful partnership with community partners for community-wide strategic planning and shared decision-making
- To co-develop an actionable CHIP that will lead to improved health outcomes
- These goals are being realized because of the dedication and commitment of our partners whose input in this process has been invaluable. We look forward to the continued collaboration that is required to implement our identified strategies and objectives for improving community health.

BACHAC Hosts Soul Stroll 2024

The Bay Area Community Advisory Council (BACHAC) hosted Soul Stroll on May 18. This year’s event returned to Coyote Point Park with its scenic views of the San Francisco Bay. Over 500 community members of all ages and abilities engaged in physical activities. Participants walked, ran, or biked for one, three, or five miles. The event also included a health and wellness fair. Over 45 community-based service organizations provided education and screening for various health conditions. This year’s Soul Stroll Ambassador was Negro Baseball League Museum Hall of Famer Kenny Lofton. Mr. Lofton's seventeen-year career included a stint with the Giants in 2002. He spoke at the opening VIP event on May 17 and stressed the importance of physical movement in resisting health conditions. He also rallied walkers to the finish during the event. Every Kid Deserves a Bike: Supporting Youth in South San Francisco

For the third year, the City of South San Francisco kicked off the [Every Kid Deserves a Bike](#) program. This program gives kids from low-income families in some South San Francisco schools a chance to get outside and grow by giving them free bikes and support. Students not only get a new bike, but they also receive bike adjustments from BikeMobile, a local nonprofit. They also get a helmet properly fitted to their head by volunteers. Additionally, students can register their bikes on-site with the South San Francisco Police Department. Students also participate in a bike safety course, and volunteers teach and help those who don't know how to ride.

The San Mateo County Transit District is recruiting applicants under 21 years old to join the Measure W Citizens Oversight Committee (COC) for the Youth and Youth Transit Riders position. The COC meetings are scheduled based on member availability, offering flexibility for youth members. Measure W, passed by San Mateo County voters in 2018, aims to improve transit and reduce traffic congestion through a ½ cent sales tax. The COC reviews the administration of the Congestion Relief Plan to ensure appropriate investment of the funds.
